Good evening Louisville families,

This is Superintendent Michele Shaffer. Our goal is to provide a safe school environment for our students and staff. The safety of students and staff is our first priority.

As you know, our community suffered a tragedy in recent days. In light of this event, you as a parent and your children may be nervous and apprehensive. LCS are aware of this and are prepared to support and keep our kids safe. The district has many safety supports and procedures in place. Along with the building security protocols, the district has counselors in every building, crisis and clinical counselors available, support from Stark County Mental Health Agencies, district SRO Officers, and work hand-in-hand with our local police and fire departments.

Over the last 24-hour period, there have been allegations that have surfaced by our students. We take each of these allegations seriously. In each allegation, we have partnered with our SRO officers and local police to investigate. Through this process, no credible source has been identified, and each allegation has been unsubstantiated.

If anyone hears or becomes aware of others talking about a situation that makes a student feel unsafe, they should report it to an adult immediately, use our See Something, Say Something anonymous hotline at 1-844-5 SAY NOW, or contact the Louisville Police Department at 330.875.1607.
